Psalm 90:12

So teach us to number our days that we may get a heart of wisdom.

Psalm 90:9-10

The years of our life are seventy, or even by reason of strength eighty; yet their span is but toil and trouble; they are soon gone, and we fly away.

German sociologist Max Weber said that the,

Waste of time is thus the first and in principle the deadliest of sins. The span of human life is infinitely short and precious.... Loss of time through sociability, idle talk, luxury, even more sleep than necessary for health . . . is worthy of absolute moral condemnation. It does not yet hold, with Franklin, that time is money, but the proposition is true in a certain spiritual sense. It is infinitely valuable because every hour lost is lost to labor for the glory of God.
